

1. Before You Begin

What is Included

Unpacking Instructions

Immediately upon receiving a fixture, carefully unpack the carton, check the contents to ensure that all parts are present, and have been received in good condition. Notify the shipper immediately and retain packing material for inspection if any parts appear damaged from shipping or the carton itself shows signs of mishandling. Save the carton and all packing materials. In the event that a fixture must be returned to the factory, it is important that the fixture be returned in the original factory box and packing.

Manual Conventions

CHAUVET® manuals use the following conventions to differentiate certain types of information from the regular text.

[10]	A DIP switch to be configured

1~512	A range of values
50/60	A set of values of which only one can be chosen
Settings	A menu option not to be modified (for example, showing the operating mode/current status)

Icons

This manual uses the following icons to indicate information that requires special attention on the part of the user.

Safety Instructions



Please read these instructions carefully, which includes important information about the installation, usage and maintenance of this product.

- Please keep this User Manual for future consultation. If you sell the unit to another user, be sure that
 they also receive this instruction booklet.
- Always make sure that you are connecting to the proper voltage, and that the line voltage you are connecting to is not higher than that stated on the decal or rear panel of the fixture.
- This product is intended for indoor use only! To prevent risk of fire or shock, do not expose fixture to rain or moisture.
- Make sure there are no flammable materials close to the unit while operating.
- The unit must be installed in a location with adequate ventilation, at least 20 in (50 cm) from adjacent surfaces. Be sure that no ventilation slots are blocked.
- Always disconnect from power source before servicing or replacing fuse and be sure to replace with same fuse source.
- Secure fixture to fastening device using a safety chain.
- Maximum ambient temperature (Ta) is 104° F (40° C). Do not operate fixture at temperatures higher than this
- In the event of a serious operating problem, stop using the unit immediately. Never try to repair the unit by yourself. Repairs carried out by unskilled people can lead to damage or malfunction. Please contact the nearest authorized technical assistance center.
- Never connect the device to a dimmer pack.
- Make sure the power cord is never crimped or damaged.
- Never disconnect the power cord by pulling or tugging on the cord.
- Never carry the fixture directly from the cord. Always use the hanging/mounting bracket.
- Avoid direct eye exposure to the light source while it is on.



3. SETUP

AC Power

This fixture runs on 100~240 VAC, 50/60 Hz. Before powering on the unit, make sure the line voltage to which you are connecting it is within the range of accepted voltages.



Always connect the fixture to a switched circuit. Never connect the fixture to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel is used only as a 0 to 100% switch.

To determine the power requirements for a particular fixture, see the label affixed to the back plate of the fixture or refer to the fixture's specifications chart. A fixture's listed current rating indicates its average current draw under normal conditions.



Always connect the fixture to a circuit with a suitable electrical ground.


Lens Replacement

This fixture comes with an optional lens that modifies the beam angle. Please see the instructions below for instructions on replacing the lens.

- 1. Remove the retainer ring.
- 2. Remove the lens (the lens will fall out without the retainer ring installed).
- 3. Insert the new lens. Use caution, as it may fall out until the retainer ring is installed in step #4!
- 4. If installing a color gel, place this between the retainer ring and the lens.
- Install the retainer ring.
- Assure that the installation is tight.



If the lens is not installed properly, it may fall out. This may be a safety hazard if installed overhead.






Disconnect the power cord before replacing a fuse and always replace with the same type fuse.



Fuse Replacement

- 1. With a flat head screwdriver wedge the fuse holder out of its housing.
- Remove the damaged fuse from its holder and replace with exact same type fuse.
- 3. Insert the fuse holder back in its place and reconnect power.








Power Linking

This fixture contains power linking via the edison outlet located next to the power input cable. Please see the diagram below for further explanation.



The maximum quantity of fixtures that may be linked is 35.







The <u>power linking</u> shown in this document is for the Chauvet® North American version ONLY! Therefore, it is the customer's responsibility to check with the Dealer/Distributor regarding power linking on the local version of the product. Connections and availability may change, depending on the power requirements and/or regulations of each country/region.

Mounting


Orientation

The LED Pinspot 360 may be mounted in any safe position, provided there is adequate room for ventilation.

Rigging

Be sure that the structure can support the weight of the fixture. Please see the "Technical Specifications" section of this manual for a detailed weight listing. Mount the fixture securely. This may be done with a screw, nut and bolt, or a hanging clamp. When rigging consider routine maintenance and DIP switch access.

- If the power link out is intended to be used with multiple fixture, take into account the length
 of each power cable, and mount the fixtures close enough to one another to accommodate
 for this.
- When aiming the fixtures, you may use the bracket adjustment knob. Loosen the knob, adjust to the desired angle, and then tighten the knob by turning clockwise. Do not use tools for this step, as it may cause damage.
- Two (2) mounting positions must be used for this fixture when hanging. This must be done
 using both of the mounting brackets, which are shown below.
- Safety cables must always be used.



4. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Configuring the Starting Address

Each fixture requires a starting address from 1~512. A fixture requiring one or more channels for control begins to read the data on the channel indicated by the starting address. For example, a fixture that uses seven DMX channels and is addressed to start on DMX channel 100, will read data from channels: 100, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105 and 106. Choose the starting addresses for each fixture so that the channels used do not overlap. In addition, you should note the starting address selected for future reference. The LED Pinspot 360 uses five DMX channels. If you are unfamiliar with DMX, download the DMX Primer from www.chauvetlighting.com.

DMX Operation

This is the operating mode which will allow for control with an external DMX controller. You must set the starting address for this mode. If this is your first time using DMX, then it is recommended that you refer to the "DMX Primer" section in the "Appendix" of this manual.

- 1. Set DIP switch [10] to the "ON" position.
- 2. Use DIP switches 1~9 to set the DMX starting address.

Master/Slave

This is the operating mode which will allow 1 fixture to act as the "master" and control all of the other "slave" fixtures. You must set both the master and the slave(s) fixtures to the correct mode for this operation.

Master Setting: Set the DIP switches for this fixture by using the below Standalone settings. This automatically sets the fixture to Master.

Slave Setting: Set the DIP switch [10] to the ON position.



It is not necessary to set the master fixture as the first fixture in the daisy chain. It may be any fixture in the daisy chain. For example: fixture 2, 5, 10 or 12, etc.



Only 1 fixture may be set to master.



Do not connect a DMX controller to the daisy chain for this operating mode.

Standalone Operation

Automatic

This product has preprogrammed auto programs. These are accessed via the DIP switches, and the movement range of the pan may be selected by choosing the appropriate DIP switches. Please see the chart below for further explanation.

DIP switch setting	Function
1, 9 ON	Auto with movement range of 90°
2, 9 ON	Auto with movement range of 180°
3, 9 ON	Auto with movement range of 270°
4, 9 ON	Auto with movement range of 360°
5. 9 ON	Auto with movement range of 540°

Sound-Active

The preprogrammed sound triggered programs are accessed via DIP switches, and the movement range of the pan may be selected by choosing the appropriate DIP switches. The sound sensitivity may be adjusted using the audio adjustment knob. Please see the chart below for further explanation.

DIP switch setting	Function
1 ON	Sound with movement range of 90°
2 ON	Sound with movement range of 180°
3 ON	Sound with movement range of 270°
4 ON	Sound with movement range of 360°
5 ON	Sound with movement range of 540°

Speed Adjustments (Automatic, Sound-Active)

Access preprogrammed static color presets via the control panel. Please see the chart below for further explanation.

DIP switch setting	Function
6 ON	Slow movement
7 ON	Medium movement
8 ON	Fast movement
6~8 ON	Combined, slowest movement
6~8 OFF	Combined, fastest movement

5. APPENDIX

Data Linking

You will need a serial data link to run light shows of one or more fixtures using a DMX controller or to run synchronized shows on two or more fixtures set to a master/slave operating mode. The combined number of channels required by all the fixtures on a serial data link determines the number of fixtures the data link can support.



Fixtures on a serial data link must be daisy chained in one single line. To comply with the EIA-485 standard, no more than 32 fixtures should be connected on one data link. Connecting more than 32 fixtures on one serial data link without the use of a DMX optically-isolated splitter may result in deterioration of the digital DMX signal.

Maximum recommended serial data link distance: 500 m (1640 ft) Maximum recommended number of fixtures on a serial data link: 32

Return Procedure

Returned merchandise must be sent prepaid and in the original packing, call tags will not be issued. Package must be clearly labeled with a Return Merchandise Authorization Number (RMA #). Products returned without an RMA # will be refused.

Call CHAUVET® and request RMA # prior to shipping the fixture. Be prepared to provide the model number, serial number and a brief description of the cause for the return. Be sure to properly pack fixture, any shipping damage resulting from inadequate packaging is the customer's responsibility.

CHAUVET® reserves the right to use its own discretion to repair or replace product(s). Fed Ex packing or double-boxing are recommended.

Note: If you are given an RMA #, please include the following information on a piece of paper inside the box:

- 1) Your name
- 2) Your address
- 3) Your phone number
- 4) The RMA #
- 5) A brief description of the symptoms

Claims

Damage incurred in shipping is the responsibility of the shipper; therefore the damage must be reported to the carrier upon receipt of merchandise. It is the customer's responsibility to notify and submit claims with the shipper in the event that a fixture is damaged due to shipping. Any other claim for items such as missing component/part, damage not related to shipping, and concealed damage, must be made within seven (7) days of receiving merchandise.
