3. Setup

AC Power

The EVE B-160Q has an auto-ranging power supply and it can work with an input voltage range of 100 to 240 VAC, 50/60 Hz.

To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart.

The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.



- **Always connect the product to a protected circuit (a circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.**
- **To eliminate unnecessary wear and improve its lifespan, during periods of non-use completely disconnect the product from power via breaker or by unplugging it.**



Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.

AC Plug

This product can be connected to a dimmer or rheostat, by plugging in to a standard outlet controlled by a dimmer or rheostat.

Fuse Replacement

1. Disconnect the product from power.
2. Using a flat-head screwdriver, unscrew the fuse holder and pull it straight out.
3. Remove the blown fuse from the holder and replace with a fuse of the exact same type and rating, T3.15 A, 250 V.
4. Re-insert the fuse holder and reconnect power.



Disconnect the product from the power outlet before replacing the fuse.



Always replace a blown fuse with one of the same type and rating.

Upgrade Firmware

To update the firmware on the EVE B-160Q, do the following:

1. Plug the flash drive into the USB port of the main fixture.
2. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Upgrade Firmware** shows on the display.
3. Press **<ENTER>**.
4. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Only this Fixture** (selects an update file for this product, or shows "No such file!"), **Multiple Fixture** (Selects an update file for this and connected EVE B-160Q products, or shows "No such file!"), or **Other Fixture Type** (selects an update file for other connected products, or shows "No such file!").
5. Press **<ENTER>**.



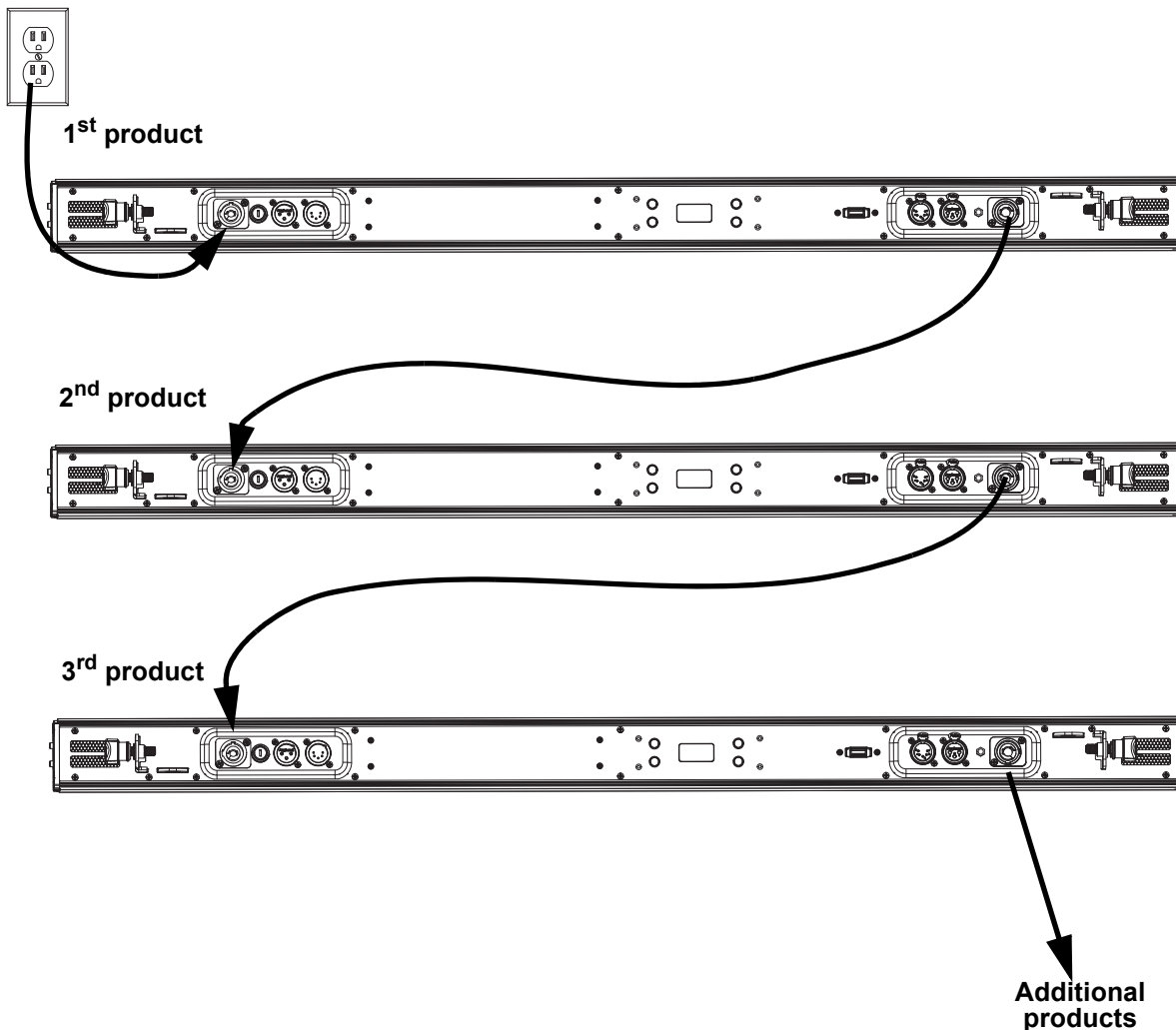
- **Place the .chl file in the root directory of the USB drive.**
- **The product's USB port supports up to 32GB capacity and only works with FAT32 file format.**

Power Linking

This product provides power linking via the outlet located in the back of the product. See the diagram below for further explanation.

Mounting

Before mounting the product, read and follow the safety recommendations indicated in the [Safety Notes](#).

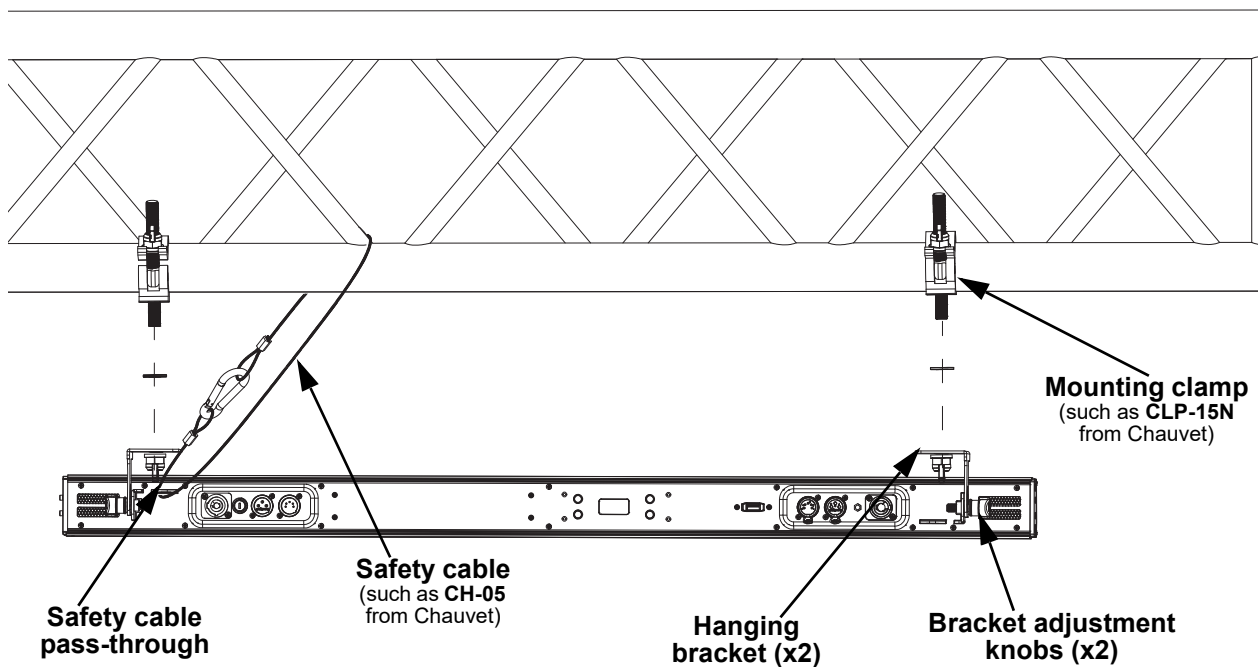
Orientation

The EVE B-160Q may be mounted in any position; however, make sure adequate ventilation is provided around the product.

Rigging

- Before deciding on a location for the product, always make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming.
- Make sure that the structure and attachment points can support the weight before hanging the product (see the [Technical Specifications](#) section for weight information).
- When mounting the product overhead, always use a safety cable. Mount the product securely to a rigging point, such as an elevated platform or a truss.
- When rigging the product onto a truss, use a mounting clamp of appropriate weight capacity. The bracket has a 13-mm hole, which is appropriate for this purpose.
- The bracket adjustment knobs allow for directional adjustment when aiming the product to the desired angle. Only loosen or tighten the bracket knobs manually. Using tools could damage the knobs.
- When power linking multiple products, mount the products close enough for power linking cables to reach.
- When mounting the product on the floor, make sure that the product and cables are away from people and vehicles.

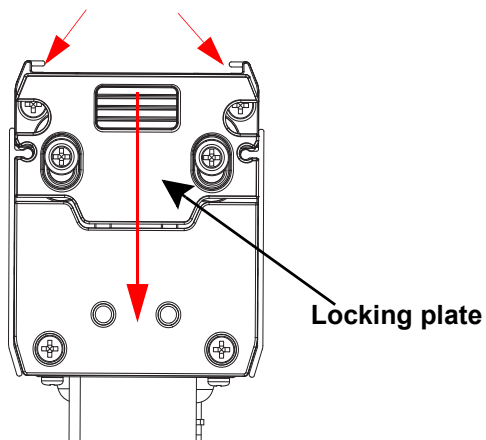
Mounting Diagram



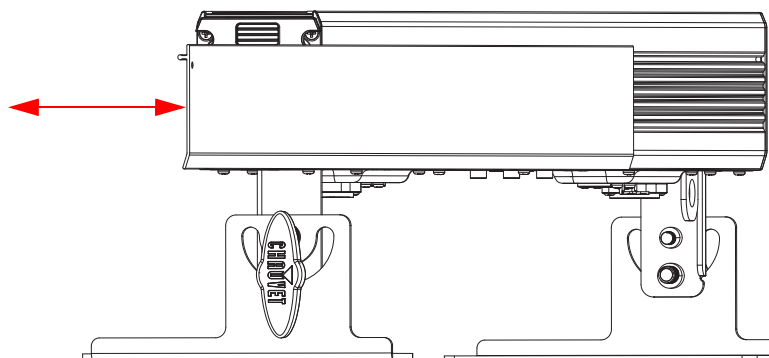
Glare Shield Installation

The EVE B-160Q comes with a glare shield, which can be stored or installed in a slot on the side of the product. The product keeps the glare shield and filter in place with a spring-loaded locking plate. To access the glare shield slots:

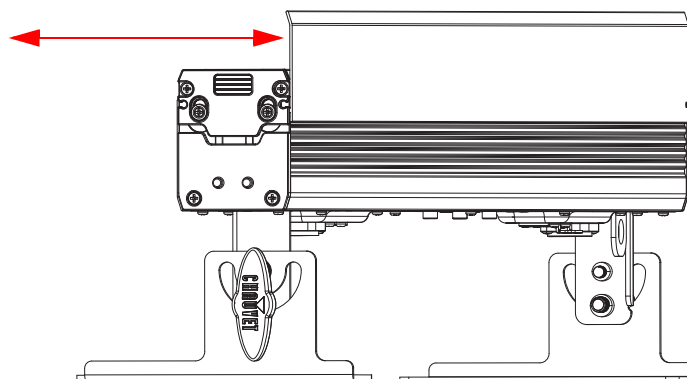
1. Press and hold down the locking plate.



2. Slide the glare shield out.



3. Turn the glare shield to the desired orientation and slide it back in.



4. Release the locking plate.

Filter Installation



 The diffusion filter can be installed by holding down the locking plate and sliding the filter into the grooved channel running the length of the product.

DMX Configuration

The EVE B-160Q works with a DMX controller. Information about DMX is in the Chauvet DMX Primer, which is available from the Chauvet website chauvetlighting.com/downloads/DMX_Primer_rev05_WO.pdf.

Starting Address

The EVE B-160Q uses up to 39 DMX channels, which defines the highest recommended address to **474**. When selecting a starting DMX address, always consider the number of DMX channels the DMX mode uses. If the starting address is set too high, access to some channels could be restricted.

For information about the DMX protocol, download the DMX Primer from www.chauvetdj.com.

To select the starting address, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>**.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DMX Address**.
3. Press **<ENTER>**.
4. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the starting address, from **001–510**.
5. Press **<ENTER>**.

DMX Personalities

The EVE B-160Q has 4 DMX personalities: 3 Ch, 4 Ch, 11 Ch, and 39 Ch.

To select which DMX personality to use, follow the steps below:

1. Press **<MENU>**.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DMX Channel**.
3. Press **<ENTER>**.
4. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **3 Ch, 4 Ch, 11 Ch** or **39 Ch**.
5. Press **<ENTER>**.

D-Fi USB Connectivity

The EVE B-160Q is able to become a D-Fi wireless receiver/transmitter with the use of the D-Fi USB from Chauvet DJ. Simply set the product's DMX Personality and DMX Address, set the DIP switch D-Fi receiving/transmitting channel, then plug it into the D-Fi USB port.



Once plugged in, the D-Fi USB will take over the product. Wired DMX and manual display control / menu buttons will be unavailable until the D-Fi USB is unplugged. The priority levels are:

1. D-Fi USB
2. Wired DMX
3. Manual Digital Display/Menu Buttons

D-Fi USB Compatibility

The D-Fi USB can receive a DMX signal from the D-Fi Hub and the FlareCON Air 2 as well as other D-Fi USB products.

D-Fi USB Configuration

1. Set the DMX Personality and DMX address on the EVE B-160Q.
2. Use the Chart provided to set **BOTH**:
 - the Channel, and then
 - The Receiving or Transmitting option

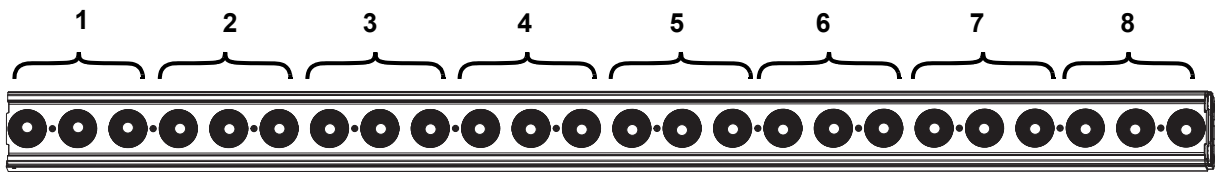

Standalone Configuration

Set the product in one of the standalone modes to operate without a DMX controller.



Never connect a product that is operating in any standalone mode to a DMX string connected to a DMX controller. Products in standalone mode may transmit DMX signals that could interfere with the DMX signals from the controller.

Virtual Color Wheel

To run the EVE B-160Q with a virtual color wheel:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Virtual Color Wheel** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Virtual Color Wheel**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **Md Yellow, Lt Yellow, Amb Yellow, Vlt Amber, Lt Amber, Md Amber, Dk Amber, Lt Red, Md Red, NC Pink, Md Pink, Dk Pink, Md Red Amber, Dk Red Amber, Magenta, Dk Magenta, Lt Lavender, Lt Blue, Vlt Blue, Lt Blue2, Blue, Md Blue, Dk Blue, Indigo, Vdk Blue, Vdk Blue2, Yel Green, Green, Turquoise, Aqua, or Blue Green**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.
7. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to increase or decrease the value of the dimmer, from **000–255**.
8. Press **<ENTER>**.

Color Temperature

To run the EVE B-160Q with a preset color temperature:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Virtual Color Wheel** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Color Temperature**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **2800K, 2900K, 3000K, 3100K, 3200K, 3300K, 3400K, 3500K, 3600K, 3700K, 3800K, 3900K, 4000K, 4100K, 4200K, 4300K, 4400K, 4500K, 4600K, 4700K, 4800K, 4900K, 5000K, 5100K, 5200K, 5300K, 5400K, 5500K, 5600K, 5700K, 6000K, 6500K, 7000K, 7500K, or 8000K**.

Manual Color Mixer

To combine colors with a manual color mixer:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Virtual Color Wheel** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Manual Color Mixer**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **R=___ (Red), G=___ (Green), B=___ (Blue), or W=___ (White)**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.
7. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to increase or decrease the value, from **000–255**.
8. Press **<ENTER>**.

Auto Show

To run the EVE B-160Q with an auto program:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Auto Show** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select an auto program, from **Auto 1–5**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to increase or decrease the value, from **001–100**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

Settings Configuration

Dimmer Curve

To select the dimmer curve on the EVE B-160Q:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Dimmer Curve** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select a dimmer curve, from **S-Curve**, **Linear**, **Square**, or **Inverse Square**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

Dimmer Mode

To select the dimmer mode on the EVE B-160Q:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Dimmer Mode** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select a dimmer mode, from **Dimmer 1–3** (fast to slow), or **Off**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

DMX Loss

To set the DMX Loss mode on the EVE B-160Q:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **DMX Loss** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **Hold** (holds the last setting), **Black** (blacks out the product), or **Auto** (sets the unit to auto mode).
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

Back Light

To set the back light timing on the EVE B-160Q:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Back Light** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **10S** (Turns off display light after 10 seconds of inactivity), **30S** (Turns off display light after 30 seconds of inactivity), **2Min** (Turns off display light after 2 minutes of inactivity), or **Always On** (display back light remains on).

To view information on the EVE B-160Q:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Information** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.

Temperature

To view the current temperature of the LEDs of the EVE B-160Q, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Temperature** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.

Factory Reset

To set the back light timing on the EVE B-160Q, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Factory Reset** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **No** (Maintains current settings) or **Yes** (resets settings to factory default).
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

Wired Master/Slave Mode

The Master/Slave mode allows a single EVE B-160Q product (the “master”) to control the actions of one or more EVE B-160Q products (the “slaves”) without the need of a DMX controller. The master product will be set to operate in either standalone mode or with the IRC-6, while the slave products will be set to operate in slave mode. Once set and connected, the slave products will operate in unison with the master product. Configure the products as indicated below.

Slave products:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **DMX Address** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to set the starting address to **001**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Connect the DMX input of the first slave product to the DMX output of the master product.
6. Connect the DMX input of the subsequent slave products to the DMX output of the previous slave product.
7. Finish setting and connecting all the slave products.

Master product:

1. Set the master product to operate in standalone mode.
2. Make the master product the first product in the DMX daisy chain.



- **Configure all the slave products before connecting the master to the daisy chain.**
- **Never connect a DMX controller to a DMX string configured for Master/Slave operation because the controller may interfere with the signals from the master.**
- **Do not connect more than 31 slaves to the master.**

D-Fi USB Master/Slave Mode

The D-Fi USB allows a single EVE B-160Q product (the “master”) to control the actions of one or more EVE B-160Q products (the “slaves”) without the need of a DMX controller or DMX cables. The master (transmitter) product will be set to operate in standalone mode, while the slave (receiver) products will be set to operate in slave mode. Once set and connected, the slave products will operate in unison with the master product.

Configure the products as indicated below.

Slave products:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **DMX Address** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to set the starting address to **001**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Set the D-Fi USB to receive on a specific channel, 1–16.
6. Plug in the D-Fi USB.
7. Finish setting and connecting all the slave products.

Master product:

1. Set the master product to operate in standalone mode.
2. Set the D-Fi USB to transmit on the D-Fi channel the slaves are receiving on.
3. Plug in the D-Fi USB.



- **All products must be set to the same DMX personality, DMX address, and D-Fi channel.**
- **Configure all the slave products before configuring the master to transmit.**
- **Never connect a DMX controller to a D-Fi channel configured for Master/Slave operation because the controller may interfere with the signals from the master.**

5. Maintenance

Product Maintenance

Dust build-up reduces light output performance and can cause overheating. This can lead to reduction of the light source's life and/or mechanical wear. To maintain optimum performance and minimize wear, clean all lighting products at least twice a month. However, be aware that usage and environmental conditions could be contributing factors to increase the cleaning frequency.

To clean the product, follow the instructions below:

1. Unplug the product from power.
2. Wait until the product is at room temperature.
3. Use a vacuum (or dry compressed air) and a soft brush to remove dust collected on the external surface/vents.
4. Clean all transparent surfaces with a mild soap solution, ammonia-free glass cleaner, or isopropyl alcohol.
5. Apply the solution directly to a soft, lint free cotton cloth or a lens cleaning tissue.
6. Softly drag any dirt or grime to the outside of the transparent surface.
7. Gently polish the transparent surfaces until they are free of haze and lint.



Always dry the transparent surfaces carefully after cleaning them.
