Unpacking Instructions

These Safety Notes include important information about installation, use, and maintenance of the Intimidator Trio XD.

- The luminaire is intended for professional use only.
- The luminaire should be positioned so that prolonged staring into the luminaire at a distance closer than 73.5 ft (22.4 m) is not expected.
- If the external flexible cable or cord of this luminaire is damaged, it shall be replaced by a special cord or cord exclusively available from the manufacturer or its service agent.
- The light source contained in this luminaire shall only be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or a similar qualified person.
- The minimum distance from irradiated object to the final lens of the luminaire is 1 m.
- The maximum exterior surface temperature is 70° C.

3. Setup

AC Power

The Intimidator Trio XD has an auto-ranging power supply and it can work with an input voltage range of 100 to 240 VAC, 50/60 Hz.

To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.



- **Always connect the product to a protected circuit (a circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.**
- **To eliminate unnecessary wear and improve its lifespan, during periods of non-use completely disconnect the product from power via breaker or by unplugging it.**



Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.

Fuse Replacement

1. Disconnect the product from power.
2. Using a Phillips-head screwdriver, unscrew the fuse holder and pull it straight out.
3. Remove the blown fuse from the holder and replace with a fuse of the exact same type and rating, F5A 250V.
4. Re-insert the fuse holder and reconnect power.



Disconnect the product from the power outlet before replacing the fuse.

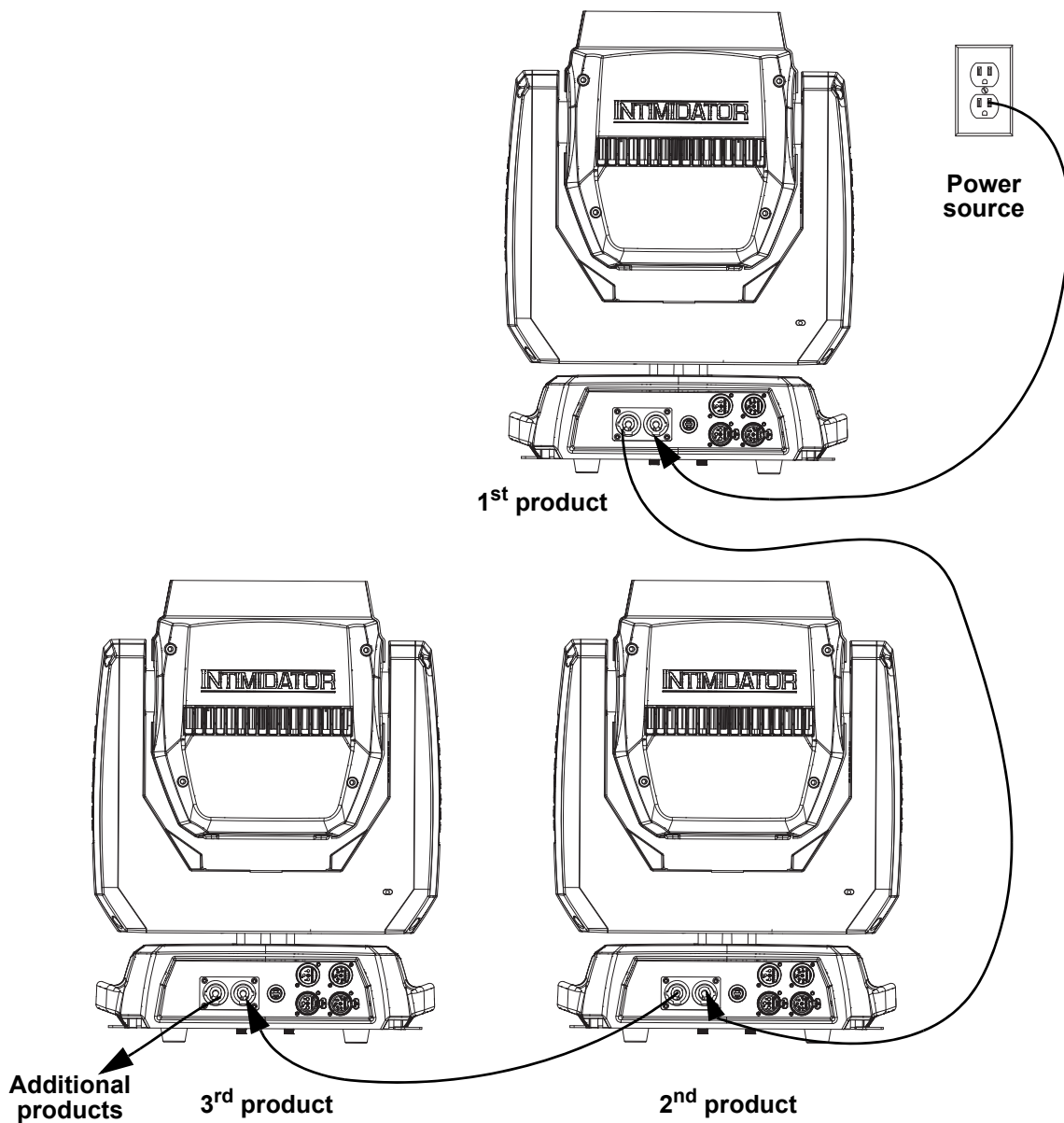


Always replace a blown fuse with one of the same type and rating.

Power Linking

This product provides power linking via the outlet located in the back of the product. See the diagram below for further explanation.

Power Linking Diagram



It is possible to link up to 3 Intimidator Trio XD products on 100 VAC, up to 4 products on 120 VAC, up to 8 products on 230 VAC, or up to 9 products on 240 VAC.



The power linking diagram shown above corresponds to the North American version of the product ONLY! If using the product in other markets, consult with the local Chauvet distributor as power linking connectors and requirements may differ by country or region.

Mounting

Before mounting the product, read and follow the safety recommendations indicated in the [Safety Notes](#).

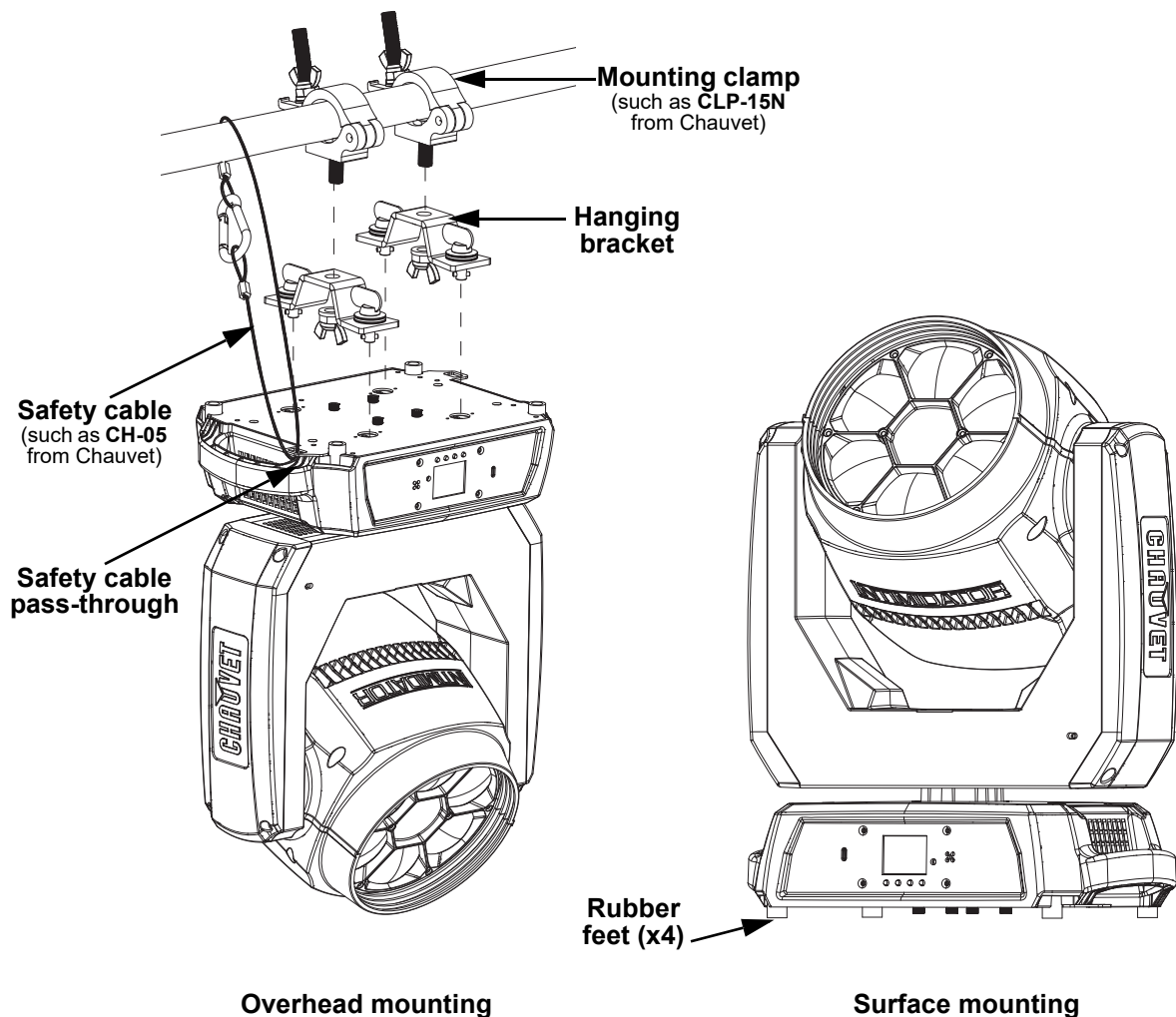
Orientation

The Intimidator Trio XD may be mounted in any position; however, make sure adequate ventilation is provided around the product.

Rigging

- Before deciding on a location for the product, always make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming.
- Make sure that the structure and attachment points can support the weight before hanging the product (see the [Technical Specifications](#) section for weight information).
- When mounting the product overhead, always use a safety cable. Mount the product securely to a rigging point, such as an elevated platform or a truss.
- When rigging the product onto a truss, use a mounting clamp of appropriate weight capacity. The bracket has a 13-mm hole, which is appropriate for this purpose.
- When power linking multiple products, mount the products close enough for power linking cables to reach.
- When mounting the product on the floor, make sure that the product and cables are away from people and vehicles.

Personality and Starting Address

Starting Address

The Intimidator Trio XD uses up to 52 DMX channels, which defines the highest recommended address to **461**.

When selecting a starting DMX address, always consider the number of DMX channels the DMX mode uses. If the starting address is set too high, access to some channels could be restricted.

For information about the DMX protocol, download the DMX Primer from www.chauvetdj.com.

To select the starting address, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>**.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **001–512**.
3. Press **<ENTER>**.

DMX Personalities

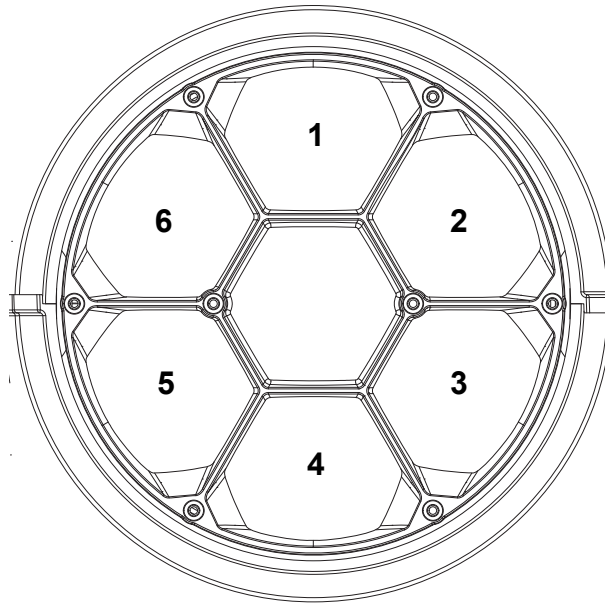
The Intimidator Trio XD has 3 DMX personalities: 16CH, 23CH, and 52CH.

To select which DMX personality to use, follow the steps below:

1. Press **<MENU>** twice.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Run Mode**.
3. Press **<ENTER>**.
4. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DMX**.
5. Press **<ENTER>**.
6. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the DMX personality, from **16CH**, **23CH**, or **52CH**.
7. Press **<ENTER>**.

Standalone Configuration

The system information includes **Ver** (displays the firmware version), **Running Mode** (displays the current running mode), **DMX Address** (displays the current DMX address), **Temperature** (displays the product temperature in °C), **Fixture Time** (numbers of hours the product has been on), **UID** (shows the product's UID), **LFAN1** (shows the LED fan speed), **Base Fan** (shows the base fan speed), and **DFI Fre** (displays the current DFI status).

Master/Slave Mode

The Master/Slave mode allows a single Intimidator Trio XD product (the “master”) to control the actions of one or more Intimidator Trio XD products (the “slaves”) without the need of a DMX controller. The master product will be set to operate in standalone mode, while the slave products will be set to operate in slave mode. Once set and connected, the slave products will operate in unison with the master product.

Configure the products as indicated below.

Slave products:

6. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the receiving **DFI Channel** from **1–16**.
7. Press **<ENTER>**.
8. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Run Mode** shows on the display. Press **<ENTER>**.
9. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Slave**. Press **<ENTER>**.
10. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the slave unit(s) from **Slave1–4**. Press **<ENTER>**.
11. Press **<ENTER>**.
12. Finish setting and connecting all the slave products.

Master product:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DFI**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **TX**, then press **<ENTER>**.
6. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the transmitting **DFI Channel** to be the same as on the receiving products from **1–16**.
7. Press **<ENTER>**.



- All products must be set to the same D-Fi channel.
- Configure all the slave products before configuring the master to transmit.
- Never connect a DMX controller to a D-Fi channel configured for Master/Slave operation because the controller may interfere with the signals from the master.

RFC Remote Control

The Intimidator Trio XD can be operated with an RFC remote or an RFC-XL remote (sold separately).

To enable RF control, the product must bind to the RFC. To bind the Intimidator Trio XD to an RFC, follow the instructions below:

2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RF**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<ENTER>** to select **BIND**.
6. Press and hold **<BLACK OUT>** on the RFC/RFC-XL until **Pairing complete** appears on the display.

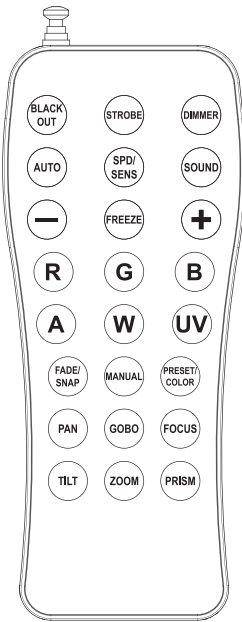
RFC Control Options

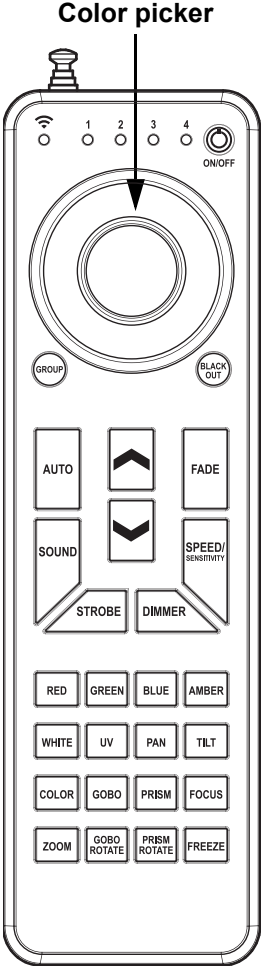

The RFC remote will not respond to any inputs when Freeze or Black Out is activated. If the remote does not respond when a button is pressed, try pressing <FREEZE> or <BLACK OUT>. Freeze or Black Out may have been inadvertently activated.

5. Maintenance

Product Maintenance

Dust build-up reduces light output performance and can cause overheating. This can lead to reduction of the light source's life and/or mechanical wear. To maintain optimum performance and minimize wear, clean all lighting products at least twice a month. However, be aware that usage and environmental conditions could be contributing factors to increase the cleaning frequency.

To clean the product, follow the instructions below:

1. Unplug the product from power.
2. Wait until the product is at room temperature.
3. Use a vacuum (or dry compressed air) and a soft brush to remove dust collected on the external surface/vents.
4. Clean all transparent surfaces with a mild soap solution, ammonia-free glass cleaner, or isopropyl alcohol.
5. Apply the solution directly to a soft, lint free cotton cloth or a lens cleaning tissue.
6. Softly drag any dirt or grime to the outside of the transparent surface.
7. Gently polish the transparent surfaces until they are free of haze and lint.



Always dry the transparent surfaces carefully after cleaning them.



Do not spin the cooling fans using compressed air because they could be damaged.

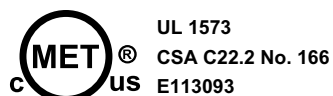
